

Mark 9:1-13

I. Jesus invites us to have confidence in Him. (1-2)

- A. See death through the lense of the resurrection.
- B. The transfiguration was a <u>preview</u> of Jesus' future coming in glory. (2 Pet. 1:16-19)
- C. God wants to <u>transform</u> believers into the likeness of Jesus. (Rom. 12:2; 2 Cor. 3:18)

And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

Romans 12:2

- II. Jesus leads a second Exodus. (2-8)
- A. Jesus is the new <u>Lawgiver</u> and Prophet.
 - (Exod. 24:12-18)

B. As the Son of God, Jesus is God.

C. We are commanded to <u>obey</u> Jesus. (cf. Deut. 18:15)

III. Jesus' glory was revealed in His death and resurrection. (9-13)

A. The glorious news about Jesus can now be <u>told</u>.

- B. Note the <u>similarities</u> between John the Baptist and Elijah.
- C. Jesus fulfilled all righteousness, and then took my <u>sin</u>.

Respond to Jesus with understanding, obedience and worship.
